

## **CGD AUTHORISED AREAS: DISTRICT WISE COVID 19 TRACKING**

**(Update Based on Notifications as of June 14, 2020)**

- Although the first Phase of Unlock-1 was implemented from June 8, 2020 across most states, there continue to be varying degrees of restrictions on inter-state movement in the form of state imposed quarantine measures for passengers. Thus although inter-state movement is no longer prohibited, it is accompanied by various degrees of restrictions that impedes business travel and operations. A vast majority of states have imposed at least seven(7) days home quarantine for asymptomatic passengers while others have higher levels of quarantine (14 days) or quarantine rules based on differentiating passengers coming from designated “High Risk Areas”. There is also a rise in cases across states which is creating further uncertainty in potentially more stringent measures being imposed in coming weeks by various states. Thus, although national level lockdown has been limited to only containment zones, there are still curtailments prevailing across states and districts hindering inter-district and inter-state movement, resulting in disruption of operations and project implementation.
- On 30.05.2020 the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India (“MHA” or “GOI”) limited the lockdown to only Containment Zones till 30<sup>th</sup> June 2020 and provided the framework for what it termed as “Phased Re-opening (Unlock-1) and vested the State Government with the authority to determine higher levels of restrictions in non-containment zones (“MHA 30 May Order”)<sup>1</sup>. The MHA 30 May Order permitted all activities outside the Containment Zones but identified certain limited activities that were still prohibited and would be permitted in a phased manner. The First Phase of allowing the identified prohibited activities was directed to commence from 08.06.2020 with opening of (i) Religious Places, (ii) Hotels, restaurants and hospitality services and (iii) Shopping Malls. The Second Phase will relate to education institutions but the decision to re-open them will be taken only in consultation with States/UTs in month of July 2020. The Third Phase will be based on assessment of the situation and will relate to : (i) international air travel of passengers, (ii) Metro Rail, (iii) Cinema Halls, Gymnasiums, Swimming pools, entertainment parks, bars, auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
- Night Curfew from 9.00 pm to 05.00 am throughout the country is applicable, except for essential activities.
- Containment Zones will be demarcated by District Authorities after taking into account MHFW Guidelines.

- MHA 30 May Order vests State Governments/UTs, based on their assessment of the situation, may prohibit certain activities or impose such restrictions outside the Containment Zones as it may deem necessary
- Thus, level of restrictions will now vary not only state to state but district to district as well depending on identification of containment zones.
- It will be critical for the stakeholders in the CGD sector to track the classification of the individual districts that comprise each authorised area and changes to the classifications that occur.
- Pursuant to the MHA 30 May Order, Our Firm has restructured the CGD COVID-19 Tracker State wise to identify the broad approach being taken by the States where CGD Authorised Areas are located on the extent of limitations being imposed in non-containment zones.

**APPROACH OF STATES (HAVING CGD G.A.) IN UNLOCK-1 PHASE I (SINCE 08.06.2020) AS PER MHA 30 MAY ORDER.**

Most states are following the MHA May 30 Orders with higher restrictions. Some states have continued with sealed borders (Chhattisgarh), some states have extended the lockdown across the state with few relaxations (West Bengal, Himachal Pradesh), some states are classifying districts into red, orange and green zones (Uttarakhand, Karnataka), inter-state movement between districts is not certain across states. States are imposing limitations on travel. The following table provides an overview of the main approaches being taken by various States in relation to level of Unlocking pursuant to the MHA 30 May Order (as of 13.06.2020):

		<p>Covid Orders 52<sup>3</sup>, 53<sup>4</sup> and 55<sup>5</sup> shall be followed in the regulation of passengers coming into the state. Covid Instant Order 52 prescribes certain measures for movement of persons coming from outside the state. Covid Instant Order 53 provides the guidelines for maintenance of strict Home Quarantine and Covid Instant Order 55 prescribes the precautions to be taken with respect to the special trains being run by the South-Central Railway.</p> <p>Domestic Passengers are classified into two categories: (i) those returning from High Risk Areas and (ii) those coming from other areas. High Risk Areas are identified as: (a) Maharashtra, (b) Gujarat, (c) Delhi, (d) Chennai, (e) Madhya Pradesh and (f) Rajasthan.</p> <p>Asymptomatic Passengers from High Risk Areas are subject to institutional quarantine for seven days in the relevant district that they are heading to. They shall be tested at the end of seven days and if found negative, shall be sent for Home Quarantine for seven days. If found positive will remain in institutional quarantine. Exceptions to Institutional Quarantine and those who will be immediately sent for home quarantine are: (i) persons above 60 years, (ii) pregnant and lactating mothers, (iii) children below the age of 10 year, (iv) persons suffering with terminally ill patients.</p> <p>Business persons can be exempted from Home Quarantine if they provide COVID negative certificate issued by ICMR authorized laboratory within the last three days of arrival. If no such certificate then quarantined till test comes negative (It should be noted that there is no time frame within which tests would be provided).</p> <p>Passengers from Other Areas will be sent for home quarantine after taking of swab for testing.</p> <p>Strict Enforcement of Home Quarantine is mandated.</p>

2.	Assam	<p>The Government of Assam has vide Order of the Assam State Disaster Management Authority dated 01.06.2020<sup>6</sup> notified certain relaxations with immediate effect. 		<p>The CMO, through its twitter handle has also announced that restricted areas will be opened in a phased manner in accordance with the provisions of the National Disaster Management Act and guidelines issued by the District Magistrate and concerned department.<sup>19</sup></p> <p>The Government of Haryana vide press release dated 31.05.2020 has informed that the District Magistrate can impose restrictions in the areas in their jurisdiction under Section 144 of the CrPC on movement of individuals from 9 pm to 5 am except for essential services. Further there will be no restriction on inter-state and inter-district movement of persons and --goods. Additionally, shops will remain open from 9 am to 7 pm. The Deputy Commissioner concerned can however impose suitable restrictions in highly congested markets depending on their own assessment. Large public gatherings or congregations continue to remain prohibited. The Haryana government has also decided to allow the functioning of offices with 100 percent attendance for Group A and B officers and 75 percent attendance for Group C and D employees. Inter-state and intra-state buses will ply as per the schedule issued by the Transport Department from time to time. In addition, the taxis and cabs will ply in accordance with the existing Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs).<sup>20</sup></p> <p>The Government of Haryana has, vide order dated 01.06.2020, issued new guidelines to implement the MHA Guidelines dated 30.05.2020 with reference to Industry and Other Established.<sup>21</sup> The new guidelines <i>inter alia</i> stipulate:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Activities in a region will only be restricted in containment and/or buffer zones, as determined by the district administration.</li> <li>(ii) During phased re-opening with Unlock 1.0 from 01.06.2020, all industrial and e-commerce establishments outside containment zones will be permitted to function with 100% staff.</li> <li>(iii) Industrial and e-commerce establishments will be permitted to operate from 6 AM to 8 PM. Continuous process industry will be allowed as per notification issued from time to time.</li> <li>(iv) All inter-state and intra-state movement of staff vehicles and goods/cargo vehicles including empty trucks/buses will be allowed.</li> </ul>

		<p>(v) The industries/industrial and commercial establishments which have resumed operations will have to ensure adherence to the lockdown measures and the National Directives for COVID-19 Management for public places as specified in MHA guidelines dated 30.05.2020.</p> <p>(vi) General Instructions/SOP's will have to be followed.</p> <p>(vii) As far as possible, the practice of work-from-home should be followed.</p> <p>(viii) Staggering of work/business hours will be followed in offices, work places, shops, markets and industrial and commercial establishments.</p> <p>(ix) Social distancing norms have to be strictly followed.</p> <p>So far, the District Magistrate of Gurgaon, Charkhi Dadri, Sirsa Jhajjar, Kaithal, Panchkula, Palwal, Yamuna Nagar, Rewai, Nuh, Kurukshetra and Sonipat have issued various orders and guidelines for the phased reopening of lockdown.<sup>22</sup></p>

		<p>distancing and health and hygiene protocols to be strictly followed. The order also provides SOPs issued for movement of trains in/out of the State, for movement of travellers by domestic flights and trains to the State, for interstate movement of employees and promoters of industries and for interstate movement of traders/raw material suppliers/service providers and inspecting authorities.</p> <p>Vide order dated 01.06.2020, the Government of Himachal Pradesh issued guidelines regarding measures to be followed by inter-state travellers. It <i>inter alia</i> provides that all inter-state travellers will have to undergo a 14 day quarantine period and a further extended 14 period of surveillance. However, asymptomatic individuals who are visiting the State for a short duration (less than 48 days) for medical/business/official purposes with permit do not have to follow quarantine provisions. Inter-state travellers from cities/areas having high load of infected cases will be have to undergo strict quarantine measures and will be strictly monitored.<sup>24</sup></p> <p>The District Magistrates can issue orders in the entire are of their jurisdiction under appropriate provisions of law such as under section 144 CrPC and ensure strict compliance. District Magistrate of Solan, Sirmaur and Bilaspur have issued such orders, so far.</p>

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		<p>that the Central Government has allowed as per the MHA order dated 30.05.2020.<sup>26</sup></p> <p>However, a Containment Order dated 01.06.2020 was issued by the Office of the Collector and District Magistrate, South Goa District which lists down the geographical areas in South Goa district as Containment Zones and Buffer Zones.<sup>27</sup> The Containment Order also provides for an action plan to be carried out in the Containment Zone. **ADDITIONAL NOTES:**

- The limitations on the activities that were applicable during the National Lockdown have been eased in phases commencing from April 20, 2020, and under the notification of May, 17 2020 all activities are permitted other than those prohibited and subject to the restrictions imposed in containment and buffer zones by the relevant district administrations. This was further expanded by MHA 30 May Order. The MHA 30 May Order also vested the State Governments and UT administration with much wider authority to determine

limitations in non-containment zones. Thus, the impact of the national lockdown, although being sought to be eased has not resulted in return to normalcy and the economic activities permitted are subject to shutdown in the event the relevant area reports COVID-19 infections.

- Earlier it was for the State Governments to operationalise the permitted activities under the MHA notifications within the State but now since all activities are permitted other than those specifically prohibited (and which cannot be changed or allowed by the State), the State notifications are now important for determining the extent of work limited within the various districts. Thus, the notifications of each State Government and each District Administration identifying containment zones and buffer zones will provide the final applicable framework.
- However, there continues to be limitations on inter-state movement and inter-district movement imposed by each State Government in exercise of its authority. The effect on the implementation of the CGD projects in each respective geographical area needs to be ascertained in light of the state level and district level limitations being imposed.

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
