

CGD AUTHORISED AREAS: DISTRICT WISE COVID 19 TRACKING

(Update Based on Notifications as of June 06, 2020)

- On 30.05.2020 the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India ("MHA" or "GOI") limited the lockdown to only Containment Zones till 30th June 2020 and provided the framework for what it termed as "Phased Re-opening (Unlock-1) and vested the State Government with the authority to determine higher levels of restrictions in non-containment zones ("MHA 30 May Order")¹. The MHA 30 May Order permitted all activities outside the Containment Zones but identified certain limited activities that were still prohibited and would be permitted in a phased manner. The First Phase of allowing the identified prohibited activities was directed to commence from 08.06.2020 with opening of (i) Religious Places, (ii) Hotels, restaurants and hospitality services and (iii) Shopping Malls. The Second Phase will relate to education institutions but the decision to re-open them will be taken only in consultation with States/UTs in month of July 2020. The Third Phase will be based on assessment of the situation and will relate to: (i) international air travel of passengers, (ii) Metro Rail, (iii) Cinema Halls, Gymnasiums, Swimming pools, entertainment parks, bars, auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
- Night Curfew from 9.00 pm to 05.00 am throughout the country is applicable, except for essential activities.
- Containment Zones will be demarcated by District Authorities after taking into account MHFW Guidelines.
- MHA 30 May Order vests State Governments/UTs, based on their assessment of the situation, may prohibit certain activities or impose such restrictions outside the Containment Zones as it may deem necessary
- Thus, level of restrictions will now vary not only state to state but district to district as well depending on identification of containment zones.
- It will be critical for the stakeholders in the CGD sector to track the classification of the individual districts that comprise each authorised area and changes to the classifications that occur.
- Pursuant to the MHA 30 May Order, Our Firm has restructured the CGD COVID-19 Tracker State wise to identify the broad approach being taken by the States where CGD Authorised Areas are located on the extent of limitations being imposed in non-containment zones.

APPROACH OF STATES (HAVING CGD G.A.) PURSUANT TO MHA 30 MAY ORDER.

Most states are following the MHA May 30 Orders with higher restrictions. Some states have sealed borders (Chhattisgarh, Delhi (for some time), UP-Delhi Border), some states have extended the lockdown across the state with few relaxations (West Bengal, Himachal Pradesh), some states are classifying districts into red, orange and green zones (Uttarakhand, Karnataka), inter-state movement between districts is not certain across states. States are imposing limitations on travel. The following table provides an overview of the main approaches being taken by various States in relation to level of pursuant to the MHA 30 May Order (as of 07.06.2020):

Andhra Pradesh	The Government of Andhra Pradesh has vide Order of the Health, Medical and Family Welfare Department dated 31.05.2020², notified that the Order of the Ministry of Home Affairs (No. 40-3/2020-DM-I(A) dated 30.06.2020) shall be implemented in the state along with various Orders issued from time to time by the State Government. The same Guidelines as attached to the Ministry of Home Affairs Order No. 40-3/2020-DM-I(A) dated 30.06.2020, are attached to the Government of Andhra Pradesh Order as well. It is further stated the Covid Orders 52³, 53⁴ and 55⁵ shall be followed in the regulation of passengers coming into the state. Covid Instant Order 52 prescribes certain measures for movement of persons coming from outside the state. Covid Instant Order 53 provides the guidelines for maintenance of strict Home Quarantine and Covid Instant Order 55 prescribes the precautions to be taken with respect to the special trains being run by the South-Central Railway.
2.	Assam	The Government of Assam has vide Order of the Assam State Disaster Management Authority dated 01.06.2020 ⁶ notified certain relaxations with immediate effect. The following activities shall be allowed with strict compliance of social distancing, hygiene and other protocols:

		 Religious places/places of worship for public from 08.06.2020 subject to a maximum gathering of 20 people per hour; Hotels, restaurants and other hospitality services from 08.06.2020 with 50% of total capacity at a time; Shopping malls from 08.06.2020 maintaining social distancing; Open spaces and public parks for yoga, morning walk etc. from 01.06.2020; Film and video shooting for Government and private sector in open spaces and studios from 01.06.2020 by maintaining social distancing; and Barber shops and parlors for hair trimming purposes only from 01.06.2020 maintaining social distancing. The other measures notified are as follows: Movement of individuals shall remain strictly prohibited between 9:00pm to 5:00am except for essential activities; Pillion riding in two wheelers is not allowed except for ladies and children below 12 years of age; Cinema halls, gymnasiums, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars, auditoriums and similar places shall remain closed; Social/ political/ sports/ entertainment/ academic/ cultural/ religious functions and other large congregations will not be allowed; Schools, colleges, coaching centers and other similar places of gathering shall remain closed until further orders; No activity whatsoever shall be permitted in Containment Zones; All other restrictions as given in order no. ASDMA.24/2020/Part-I/57 dated 18.05.2020⁷ shall continue to remain in force. These include prohibition of all domestic and international air travel of passengers except for medical services, air ambulance and for security purposes as permitted; all passenger movement by trains, except for security purposes; and inter-state buses for public transport and private vehicles except as permitted by State Government.
3.	Bihar	The Government of Bihar has vide Order of the Home Department dated 31.05.20208, notified that the State Government has decided that the Order of the Ministry of Home Affairs (No. 40-3/2020-DM-I(A) dated 30.05.2020) and the Guidelines attached therewith will be implemented and complied with in the State of Bihar.

4.	Chandigarh	As per the lockdown guidelines of 31.05.2020, revised lockdown measures are extended until 30.06.2020. The following activities <i>will be allowed</i> with effect from 08.06.2020: 1. Religious places/ places of worship for public, 2. Hotels, restaurants and other hospitality services, 3. Shopping malls. Containment zones will be demarcated by District Authorities after taking into consideration the guidelines of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. ⁹ The earlier guidelines of 18.05.2020 stated that the UT of Chandigarh continued to be in the Red Zone until further orders. ¹⁰
5.	Chhattisgarh	The State Government decided to implement the Central Government guidelines with some revisions: The state borders are to remain closed, and e-passes will be mandatory for people coming from other states. Religious places, shopping malls, cinema halls, public parks, sports complexes and stadiums will remain closed till 07.06.2020 Only essential services will be allowed in identified containment zones. ** The Order is unavailable, so a news article has been relied upon. ¹¹

7.	Delhi (National Capital Territory)	 Government of NCT Delhi has extended the lockdown for Containment Zones in NCT of Delhi till 30.06.2020 vide order dated 01.06.2020.¹³ In areas outside the Containment Zones, the prohibited and permissible activities (with specified restriction) will be as per Annexure A of the order dated 30.06.2020. The prohibited activities include the following: Metro Rail Services All schools, colleges, educational/training/coaching institutions etc. will remain closed. Hotels and other Hospitality services, except quarantine facilities, those meant for housing healthcare workers, police, government officials, stranded persons and running of canteens at bus depots, railway stations and airports. Delhi Government has released an official list of Containment Zones in Delhi as on 01.06.2020.¹⁴The list of Containment Zones will be further updated from time to time by district authorities.

		The CMO, through its twitter handle has also announced that restricted areas will be opened in a phased manner in accordance with the provisions of the National Disaster Management Act and guidelines issued by the District Magistrate and concerned department. ¹⁷
		The Government of Haryana vide press release dated 31.05.2020 has informed that the District Magistrate can impose restrictions in the areas in their jurisdiction under Section 144 of the CrPC on movement of individuals from 9 pm to 5 am except for essential services. Further there will be no restriction on inter-state and inter-district movement of persons and goods. Additionally, shops will remain open from 9 am to 7 pm. The Deputy Commissioner concerned can however impose suitable restrictions in highly congested markets depending on their own assessment. Large public gatherings or congregations continue to remain prohibited. The Haryana government has also decided to allow the functioning of offices with 100 percent attendance for Group A and B officers and 75 percent attendance for Group C and D employees. 		State, for interstate movement of employees and promoters of industries and for interstate movement of traders/raw material suppliers/service providers and inspecting authorities.
		The District Magistrates can issue orders in the entire are of their jurisdiction under appropriate provisions of law such as under section 144 CrPC and ensure strict compliance.
10.	Goa	As on 06.06.2020, Government in Goa has not come out with any revised guidelines pertaining to the MHA order dated 30.05.2020. ²¹ Goa's chief minister has however stated that the Government in Goa will grant all relaxations that the Central Government has allowed as per the MHA order dated 30.05.2020. ²²
		However, a Containment Order dated 01.06.2020 was issued by the Office of the Collector and District Magistrate, South Goa District which lists down the geographical areas in South Goa district as Containment Zones and Buffer Zones. ²³ The Containment Order also provides for an action plan to be carried out in the Containment Zone.
11.	Gujarat	As per Press Release dated 01.06.2020 issued by the Government of Gujarat, the Chief Minister has announced the 'Unlock-1" guidelines, which will be implemented from 01.06.2020. As per the guidelines there will be no relaxation in containment zones except for essential goods and services. In areas other than containment zones, trade and offices will continue from 8 AM to 7 PM. Further, curfew will be imposed in the entire state from 9 PM to 5 AM. The ST buses will run with 60% seating capacity across the state. Additionally city bus service will be permitted to start operations in the entire state with 50% capacity. Hotels, restaurants, religious places, malls will not be operational till June 8 as per Government of India guidelines. Norms of social distancing and health and hygiene protocols to be strictly followed.

		The Press Release also states that the health department will finalize and announce the state's containment zone areas by Sunday evening

Jharkhand	The Government of Jharkhand has issued an order to direct all departments and district administrations for strict implementation of the order of the Ministry of Home Affairs dated 30.05.2020 strictly for a period upto 30.06.2020. Only the following activities shall be permitted outside the containment zones till 30.06.2020 —
		(i) Service centres for electronics; (ii) call centres of private companies; (iii) shops selling permitted items in district headquarter urban areas; (iv) garages and motor workshops in district administration areas; (v) restaurants (home delivery and takeaway) in district administration headquarters; (vi) intra-district plying of public transport. 		 Under Phase I, the re-opening of areas outside the Containment Zones include religious places/places of worship, hotels, restaurants and other hospitality services, and shopping malls from 08.06.2020 onwards. Opening up of Phase II and Phase III will be done after further assessment as per the MHA Order. Night curfew shall be applicable between 9pm and 5am, except for essential activities.

		 The lockdown will continue in Containment Zones demarcated by District authorities (and Buffer Zones as necessary by the District authorities) with only essential activities being permitted in them. Inter-state and intra-state movement of persons and goods shall be unrestricted. Inter-state movement of persons to Karnataka shall be decided based on assessment of the prevalence of Covid-19 in various states, and separate orders will be issued in this respect by the Health and Family Welfare Department. Movement by passenger trains, Shramik special trains, domestic air travel, movement of Indian nationals stranded abroad, evacuation of foreign nationals and sign-on and sign-off of Indian seafarers will continue to be regulated by SOPs issued. Employers should ensure on best effort basis that Aarogya Setu is installed by all employees. District authorities may also advise individuals to install the app. The Karnataka state government also maintains the classification of districts into Red, Orange and Green zones, and this data is available on the Karnataka Covid-19 Dashboard.²⁸
14.	Kerala	 The Government of Kerala has vide Order of the General Administration Department dated 01.06.2020²⁹, notified that the regulations in the Order of the Ministry of Home Affairs (No. 40-3/2020-DM-I(A) dated 30.06.2020) would be applicable to the entire State of Kerala with the following additional measures: No inter-state public transport by road is allowed. Inter-state movement of persons by all modes of transport would be regulated only through pass issued under COVID 19 jagratha platform; Inter district movement of buses would be limited to the adjoining districts only. No standing passengers shall be permitted; The number of persons allowed in auto rickshaws is limited to two other than driver, and in case of four wheeler is limited to three other than the driver; Indoor shooting of cinema in a studio or indoor setting is allowed subject to a maximum of 50 persons. Shooting for TV serials is permitted on same conditions with a maximum limit of 25 persons; Business travelers, technical/professional personnel coming for work and those returning from Kerala within a week are exempted from the provisions of quarantine;

Madhya Pradesh	The Home Department of the Madhya Pradesh Government vide notification dated 31.05.2020 has issued certain instructions and relaxations which are to remain in force outside the containment zones till 15.06.2020. No passes shall be required for inter state movement. Inter state buses can ply from 07.06.2020. Intra state passenger buses can ply except in Indore, Ujjain and Bhopal. Within the municipal limits of Indore, Ujjain, Buhranpur, Neemach 25% shops can function in rotation. In the municipal limits of Bhopal, 33% shops can function in rotation. In Dewas, Khandwa, Dhar municipal limits, 50% can function in rotation. Outside these municipal limits, all shops may function. School, colleges and other educational institutions shall remain closed. In Indore, Bhopal and Ujjain, government and private offices can function with upto 50% staff in rotation. Other than essential services, all other services shall cease to function between 9pm and 5am.
		The district administration shall update the containment zone lists from time to time. ³¹
16.	Maharashtra	Government of Maharashtra has issued order dated 31.05.2020 providing directions for easing of restrictions and Phase-wise opening of lockdown (MISSION BEGIN AGAIN). ³² Containment zones will be demarcated by Municipal/District Authorities after taking into consideration the guidelines of MoHFW. The municipal commissioners in corporation areas and district collectors in other parts of the district are empowered to decide the containment zones. Further, Phase I will be in effect in Maharashtra from 03.06.2020, Phase II in effect from 05.06.2020 and Phase III in effect from 08.06.2020. The Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation has prepared a list of containment zones ³³ along with a map. ³⁴

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

- The limitations on the activities that were applicable during the National Lockdown have been eased in phases commencing from April 20, 2020, and under the notification of May, 17 2020 all activities are permitted other than those prohibited and subject to the restrictions imposed in containment and buffer zones by the relevant district administrations. This was further expanded by MHA 30 May Order. The MHA 30 May Order also vested the State Governments and UT administration with much wider authority to determine limitations in non-containment zones. Thus, the impact of the national lockdown, although being sought to be eased has not resulted in return to normalcy and the economic activities permitted are subject to shutdown in the event the relevant area reports COVID-19 infections.
- Earlier it was for the State Governments to operationalise the permitted activities under the MHA notifications within the State but
 now since all activities are permitted other than those specifically prohibited (and which cannot be changed or allowed by the State),
 the State notifications are now important for determining the extent of work limited within the various districts. Thus, the notifications
 of each State Government and each District Administration identifying containment zones and buffer zones will provide the final
 applicable framework.
